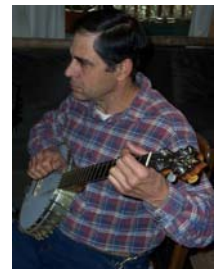

Tallahassee's best Irish trad band transports your heart and soul to the Emerald Isle with a lively assortment of reels, jigs, and songs. The band features Lynnsey Smith, winner of the Florida Folk Festival's fiddle contest; Steve Hodges (guitar, octave mandolin, tenor banjo, mandolin, and vocals); and Jim Cox (wooden flute, whistle, and uilleann bagpipes). Band members have been playing together for a decade or more and offer the best and most diverse traditional sound to be found in Tallahassee.

A hard-core traditionalist and authentic interpreter of old-time American country music. Frank plays banjo and guitar using fingering styles that are nearly forgotten, and he sings music that reaches back to the years of pioneers and westward expansion. He is truly an American treasure.
